# **EIGHTH GRADE REGISTRATION FORM**

Dear Seventh Grade Families,

It has been a joy having your child at the junior high this year. We are looking forward to the year ahead and want to get information from you to help us create your child's schedule. Please talk about this information with your child and then fill out the registration form using this <u>REGISTRATION FORM LINK</u>. We will need your family to complete this form by Friday, May 10, 2024. Completing the form should only take a few minutes.

I have included general information about the eighth grade classes on the Registration Form, but here is an overview of a eighth grade student's scheduling options as well.

# ALL STUDENTS WILL TAKE:

English History Math\* Science Electives (Attend every other day) Art Computers Classics (Latin) Physical Education Fine Art / Study Hall: Families will select if their child will continue with band/choir or replace this class with a study hall.

\* Students with passing grades in their current math class will be placed in the next sequential math class. Students that received a fail in either semester will repeat their current math class in an eighth grade classroom. Please reach out to your child's current math teacher with any questions.

### ENRICHMENT CLASSES

Your child's seventh grade teacher in English, history, and science might recommend them for the enrichment class in their discipline using the criteria below. You might receive an additional email over the next two weeks from your child's teacher letting you know if your child has been recommended for the Enrichment section. Students can take enrichment classes in two of the three areas. We ask you to prioritize these subjects on their digital registration form to help us schedule them into the enrichment classes that they are most interested. Enrichment Criteria for TCA Junior High

- Students should be high performing, self-motivated, possess good work ethics and habits. High test scores and grades should be considered, but they should not be the only criteria.
- Less than highest performing students can at times be excellent enrichment candidates if they possess passion for the subject, consistently complete their homework throughout the school year, and be able to come to class each day ready to learn and discuss.
- Students are able to function with minimal parent support (lots of parent interest is always encouraged, i.e., asking what did you do in class today at the dinner table, applauding effort, etc.)
